	prose about a conflict (not necessarily a war). In reference to the

	condemns conflict. Students will demonstrate their use and	
	understanding of poetic devices in this task. Students can choose to	
	write either a number of smaller poems or one longer piece.

Science	Investigation- Ecosystems: Students will choose 1 out of 5 topics to	Week 4

	connect ideas and understand that an ecosystem is a complex web	
	of interactions between biotic and abiotic factors.

HASS	Forming political parties and contesting an election: Students will learn about the way government is structured in Australia, interpret the Declaration of Human Rights, and discuss issues important to them. Students will form political parties with their peers and contest a mock election against other parties in their class. The assessment task for this will include: The production of political pamphlets, posters and other propaganda and a letter to their constituents outlining their party platform and policies. 	Economics: Triple Bottom Line Analysis- The Fashion Industry Students conduct an investigation into the fashion industry in particular, the issue of waste. Students conduct a triple bottom line analysis for making and buying a T-shirt looking at financial, social and environmental factors. They also provide a written response using the paragraph structure- PEEL (Point, Evidence, Elaborate, and Link).	Week 7 - 10
