Subject	Assessment Task	Due
English	Bookwork Students will complete a reading reflection journal as they progress through the chosen novel. They will make profiles on important characters, and acquire new vocabulary to assist them in completing the two main assessment tasks detailed below. The grammar focus in Year 7 this term will be on sentence structure and improving students' writing cohesion.	Ongoing Weeks 1-10
	Interview Students will be required to conduct a 2-3 minute interview with a partner where one student plays the character (the interviewee), and the other plays the interviewer. Working in pairs to create a jointly constructed script of questions and answers that show their understanding of the novel. This will then be presented as an oral presentation.	Week 5
	Novel Analytical Essay Students will write a text response essay. The focus will be on developing students' paragraph writing through teaching the PEEL (Point, Evidence, Elaborate, Link) framework in class.	Week 10
Maths	Fractions Recipe Project Students will demonstrate their understanding of multiplying and dividing fractions by using recipes.	Week 6
	Statistics Project Students will collect data on a topic of their choice, complete a statistical analysis and present their findings as either a poster, brochure or PowerPoint presentation.	Weeks 9 - 10
	Fortnightly Quizzes Students will demonstrate their learning with short, fortnightly quizzes on decimals, fractions, statistics and probability.	Fortnightly
Science	Ecosystem Report Students will research a specific ecosystem, including doing field research at the Desert Park. They will create a dichotomous key, the taxonomy of organisms, and a food web based on their research.	Weeks 6 - 10
